Companies in every sector are relying less and less on paper-based records, and more on electronic records and transfers of information. However, whereas paper records that can be kept under lock and key or in secured locations, electronic records are more vulnerable to breach when not maintained properly. There is a patchwork of privacy and data security laws at the federal and state levels of which companies should be aware. This panel will provide an introduction and overview of privacy and information security laws in the United States, as well as recent enforcement actions and challenges.
